Dental Services

Here is some information about the dental services offered today for your pet.

Older patients should have blood work run to detect any problems with their organs such as kidney and liver function, abnormal glucose or anemia. Older pets should also have an IV placed, and fluids given while under anesthesia.

Once the pet has been anesthetized we will explore and evaluate the mouth and all teeth. Most of the time the teeth just need to be cleaned and polished, however sometimes we need to perform tooth xrays to determine the condition of the underlying roots. Occasionally the tooth/teeth are in poor shape and need to be extracted (removed). Each animal will be different depending on the degree of dental problems. Some teeth can be saved with root canals. We do not perform root canals here, but would be happy to refer you to a veterinary dental specialist if you are interested.

Pre Anesthesia Blood work run here \$128.00
Anesthesia, hospitalization, cleaning/polishing and IV fluids \$160 – 235
Tooth x-rays \$65.00
Extractions can range from \$10 for a simple tooth with one root to \$65 for a complex tooth with multiple roots.
Antibiotics and pain medication \$20 – 50
